Non-agenda item inquiries:

Judy Grochowalski-2464 Leonard St. Comment about chickens. References Hudsonville plats with property sized of about .25 acres, and they allow the keeping of chickens, and how it has not been a problem. States land size should not prohibit the keeping of chickens.

New Business

- Text Amendments
 - o Outdoor Storage in Commercial Districts

Greg Ransford takes the floor to discuss the first draft language for outdoor storage. Discussion among Commissioners and Greg Ransford. Discussion about the size of storage that should be allowed. Commissioners agree with all except for section E, regarding the size. Commissioners agree they would like to see outdoor space limited to 50% of the primary building size. Discussion about the style and type of fence and gate material requirements.

o Keeping of Animals – Chickens

Greg Ransford takes the floor to address the language regarding the keeping of chickens. Discussion of parcel size requirements among Greg Ransford and Commissioners. Agreement to update the language to change the minimum parcel size to 1.5 acres with 6 chickens allowed. Then 1 additional chicken per ¼ acre increase, which follows the current formula calculation.

 - Park bathroom building

Greg Ransford explains the nature of this project, and how review of the Commissioners is requested. Joel Terpstra explains the desire for this structure. It will be placed near the pickleball

courts and pavilion. Will install septic and drain field. It will be a modular type structure, rather than stick and mortar style to keep the project at a reasonable cost.

Matt Fenske motions to approve the site plan, Marv Bennink seconds and it carries unanimously.
